# Tony Bilson's back at Berowra Waters Inn



Restaurateur Tony Bilson is busy refurbishing the Berowra Waters Inn, including bringing in a python to assist with pest removal.

HE'S been responsible for some of the most iconic restaurants in Australia and has nurtured world famous chefs, including Tetsuya Wakuda. But after 30 years of fluctuating fortunes the godfather of Australian modern cuisine, Tony Bilson, is returning to the Berowra restaurant that made him famous. Bilson confirmed he will reopen the Berowra Waters Inn on October 12, which he first opened with his former wife Gay in 1977. Bilson said he had his doubts when owner and friend, Jeremy Law, approached him after the collapse of previous chef Dietmar Sawyere's restaurant group in June. "Initially I thought: 'it's going backwards', but it's just such a special place," he said. "The thought of someone else taking over was too much. I love the place, I love the area, I feel very much at home. "The image of Berowra is a great image for Australia generally, to have a gastronomic venue, and this place is world famous, in such a remote and isolated place is very special. I just want it to be the best restaurant in Australia and I am hoping to stay here forever."

# **RIVER HISTORY**

## 1. The Hawkesbury –

The second expedition by Governor Phillip to locate a fresh water supply for the new settlement of Sydney Cover left Brisbane Water (the North Arm of Broken Bay) on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> June, 1789. The party consisted of about 20 men in two small boats who proceeded to a campsite on Dangar Island (which they named Mullet Island because of the large number of mullet caught there). On the 11<sup>th</sup> June, they discovered Mullet Creek, which they decided was shallow and only navigable by small boats. Two days later, on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup>, they continued upstream to a section which would have been the MacDonald River, noticing that the water was becoming quite fresh. However, their supplies were low and they had to return to Port Jackson for a few days to rest and to re-supply. On the 29<sup>th</sup> June, the third expedition by Governor Phillip left Port Jackson and proceeded to the junction of the MacDonald River. After numerous days spent exploring the Colo and MacDonald rivers, they returned down river and noticed some smaller branches of the river. It is believed they spent the night of the 9<sup>th</sup> July in Berowra Creek. They then returned to Dangar Island and then down to Pittwater, where they left their boats and proceeded back to Sydney Cove. Phillip had achieved his purpose in locating the mouth of a large, fresh water river which had been sought by him since he arrived in New South Wales 18 months earlier. Phillip named the river to honour Charles Jenkinson, First Earl of Liverpool, England and the Baron of Hawkesbury .

#### 2. Joe Crafts Bay -

Is situated on the western shore of Berowra Creek opposite Collingridge Point. It is named after Joseph Craft (1770-1839) who arrived with the Third Fleet in 1791 and after several brushes with the law acquired 60 acres at Milkmaid Reach about 1811. He married Sarah Robinson in 1810 and had a son, also named Joseph. About 1821 he and his wife moved to "Primrose Hill" in Mangrove Creek where he became known as a skilled sawyer.

#### 3. The Woolwash –

Is situated about one kilometre up from the Berowra Waters ferry crossing. It was named because early settlers brought wool here by boat where it was washed in spring water and then taken by boat to Pittwater or Sydney.
