LEST WE FORGET





RIVER HISTORY

- 1. America and Refuge Bays The name America Bay was first mentioned by Surveyor Larmer as early as 1832. The name probably originated from the use of the bay by American whaling and sealing vessels, large numbers of which worked along the New South Wales coast in the early 1800's. In 1840 the captain of the "Beagle" reported that there were between 200 and 300 American whalers working along the coast. The bay offered a sheltered anchorage with a supply of fresh water close at hand and also had the advantage of being hidden from the government back in Port Jackson. In 1942 Refuge Bay was a top-secret training base for the Z force when preparing for their daring raid on Singapore Harbour. They used the "Krait", a 20 m ex-Japanese fishing boat. The force's camp was on the plateau above the waterfall and they used the bay to train in their kayaks. The "Krait" sailed from Refuge Bay in January 1943 and returned from Darwin in October 1943. The ship is now on display at the National Maritime Museum in Sydney. There is a commemorative plaque of her on the rocks close to the waterfall.
- 2. Milson Island. Was earlier named Mud Island, but was changed when the island was acquired by the Milson family during the second half of the 1800's. When Robert Wilson died in 1866 he became one of the well known river pioneers whose remains were buried at St Johns Cemetery on Bar Island. It is said that the Federal Government acquired the island in the early 1900's in order to establish a primary industries quarantine station which was later converted into an isolation hospital for WWII servicemen suffering from contagious diseases. Milson and nearby Peat Island were later used to house patients suffering from mental illnesses. Milson Island was later converted into a low security prison and is now used as a fitness centre for the Department of Sports and Recreation.
- 3. Ballast Island is a heap of rocks marked by a green mark in Berowra Creek near Twin Beaches at the entrance to **Marramarra Creek. It is submerged at high tide. During the 1800's empty sailing vessels coming up the Hawkesbury** from Sydney needed ballast in their hulls to add weight to their vessels to make them more stable during the **voyage along the coast. Examination of Captain Hunter's 1789 chart shows three tiny islands in this spot. Rather than** creating additional hazards by dumping ballast at random, it made sense to unload rocks on top of an existing hazard here in order to avoid creating additional hazards to navigation.

Navigation lights on inflatables are always a problem as the suction cups just won't stick properly to the Hypalon or vinyl. A good way around this is to attach the portable nav light through the "D" ring on the inside of your dinghy after attaching the light to conduit as shown in the photo. The foot of the conduit is secured by screwing or gluing a round metal chair leg rubber cup to the floor of the dinghy just below the "D" ring and pushing the pipe into. Make sure it is a snug fit as this stops it turning. For the stern I have used a small round LED light with a magnet in it that you can pick up from the dollar shops for about \$5.00. I Found an old park light lens that I put over the light but it works OK without doing that . I attached an end cap used to seal plumbers pipe to the top of the outboard with Sikaflex and glued a steel washer inside so the magnet would stick and it would be easy to take the light out to change the battery. It works well and doesn't get in the way or get accidentally knocked off.

Rubbish on a boat is always a problem and for some reason it grows quicker than at home. There is a new boat on a mooring near the Inn and he has a good way of lessening the volume of rubbish. He has a can crusher attached to the side of his ladder and crushes all cans before they go in the garbage bag. I know you can stomp on the cans but they do tend to scratch fibreglass and timber. Happy and safe boating.......Glenno
