TELSTRA

Finally Telstra has shutdown the CDMA network (that's the one that worked in regional areas and at Berowra Waters). We are now in "The Dead Zone" (remember the Front page newspaper article that was emailed to you all, Thank you Cindi Monks and Carol Hughes). We desperately need "The Promised Tower". A few of us have experimented with "Mini" towers that you strap onto your back, these are called high gain aerials that you connect to the right phone, a blue tick phone that has an aerial socket, this works but it is not very portable. These aerials can be expensive, but if you are persistant and jump up and down enough, Telstra will give them to you free of charge, i.e. you pay for them at the store and they credit your phone account. Once "The Promised Tower" is installed we may be able to discard the aerials. If anyone has had any success with a particular phone or aerial, I would be interested to hear about it. Please let me know. I have to report that my two aerials are working very well indeed. I have a small aerial that plugs into the back of my phone which I use in the car at Berowra and in the Dinghy. The large fiberglass aerial I keep on my boat and its lead connects to the back of my phone, it works well.

The next day came, but no phone call, but another letter arrived from Maritime confirming their position not to grant us permission, even though we have an official letter to the contrary. The committee is still considering our position and next course of action.
